Advocacy

Since July 4, members of the State Legislature have been away from the Capitol on summer recess. They are set to return on August 4, leaving approximately four weeks to complete the business of the 2013-14 Legislative Session.

The two bills most prominent on CANP's radar have met with distinctly different fates. Assembly Bill 2015 (Chau) was held on the suspense file of the Assembly Appropriations Committee and will thus not advance this year. The measure would have prohibited a health care service plan or health insurer from discriminating against any health care provider who is acting within the scope of that provider's license or certification, as specified.

Meanwhile, Assembly Bill 1841 (Mullin) was passed out of the Assembly in May and was moved to the Senate. In that house, the bill was passed by the Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development and is now eligible for a full Senate floor vote. Through two policy committees and action by the full Assembly, the bill has yet to garner a single "no" vote.

AB 1841 would allow medical assistants to hand patients properly labeled medication and prepackaged prescription drugs, other than controlled substance, ordered by a physician and surgeon, a licensed podiatrist, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or certified nurse-midwife, as specified.

While advocacy efforts have regarded these bills as CANP's highest priorities this year, grassroots outreach continues to be focused on building on the momentum established last year in support of SB 491, with the anticipation that Sen. Ed Hernandez will introduce another bill seeking full practice authority for California nurse practitioners in 2015. As was emphasized during Lobby Day in May, CANP members are urged to continue engaging their fellow chapter members in outreach efforts conducted at the local level. Still a vital component of these future efforts is that each chapter carries out the direction to appoint a chapter Legislative Representative to coordinate local outreach through Stephanie Tseu, CANP Grassroots Coordinator.

In anticipation of next year's bill, further efforts have been devoted to increasing contributions to CANP's Political Action Committee (PAC). A strategy for spurring PAC donations has been developed, entailing aggressive marketing tactics via email, direct mail, social media and the CANP website. The campaign is due to launch shortly.

- Emphasize the importance of contribut9ing to the CANP Political Action Committee in anticipation of the introduction of another full practice authority bill in 2015.

Membership Renewals

CANP renewal efforts are on-going with members coming up for renewal on a monthly basis. We are currently in very important renewal period. This July we had over 1,000 members up for renewal. As CANP notifies members several times regarding their upcoming renewal, it is equally important for chapter leaders to reach out to those members as well.

CANP has a standing goal of growing membership by 5% annually. In order to achieve this goal, Chapters are asked to motivate members to renew on time, encourage prospective members and colleagues to join, and reach out to continue engagement between Chapter leaders and members.

Action for Chapters:

- Contact members that haven't attended a meeting lately and re-invite them to attend meetings -- the personal contact provides a great opportunity to re-engage the member
- Offer creative incentives for people to promote CANP membership to colleagues

Membership Committee

Action for Chapters:
