Advocacy

Governor Brown signed three bills supported by CANP in the days leading up to the October 11 deadline for gubernatorial action on bills passed this year by the Legislature. The three bills are:

<u>Assembly Bill 775 (Chiu)</u>, which will enact the Reproductive Freedom, Accountability, Comprehensive Care, and Transparency Act, which helps to ensure that women receive prompt access to affordable, comprehensive reproductive-health care and are empowered to make fully informed decisions.

<u>Senate Bill 675 (Liu)</u>, which will require hospitals and other facilities to provide caregiver and transitional support upon discharge.

<u>Assembly Bill X2 15 (Eggman)</u>, which will allow terminally-ill Californians to request a doctor's prescription for medication to aid in dying. The "End of Life Option Act" passed as part of the special session on health care called by the Governor.

Previously, the Governor signed <u>Assembly Bill 637 (Campos)</u>, which would allow nurse practitioners and physician assistants to sign and create valid Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment (POLST) forms, cleared its final legislative hurdle on July 6 when the measure was passed by the full Senate. Governor Brown signed the bill on August 17. The new law will take effect on January 1, 2016.

Lawmakers are now on recess (though the special session on health care is technically ongoing). They are slated to return to Sacramento on January 4, 2016 to begin the second year of the 2015-16 legislative session. That means the next nine-plus weeks provide an ideal opportunity to schedule an office visit with your state legislators to continue the process of educating and building relationships – including in support of <u>Senate Bill 323</u>, which is eligible to to be taken up again in January.

Extensive grassroots efforts by CANP members and allies to date has made significant inroads in terms of educating lawmakers about just what a nurse practitioner is and the vital role that NPs play. While this focus must continue, it is also important that NPs convey to legislators the barriers created by the current requirement for physician supervision, and how NPs can better serve the health care needs of Californians if the restrictions are lifted.

An exercise conducted by CANP Legislative Advocate Kristy Wiese and political consultant Andrew Acosta during the October 17 Leadership Summit revealed a key messaging point with regard to the bill: if the bill were to pass, the level of collaboration between NPs and MDs would not change much at all from current practices; the key change would be the removal of the barrier that the current antiquated law places on NPs which prevents them from serving patients to the full extent of their training and expertise.

Action for Chapters:

- Designate one Legislative Representative per chapter as one key contact for the chapter.
- Continue to meet with legislators to educate and develop a relationship with them, with special emphasis on the role that NPs fill in the healthcare delivery system AND how that role is impeded by current requirements for physician supervision.
- For assistance in making appointments with Legislators, consult with Grassroots Coordinator Stephanie Tseu (<u>canpgrassroots@gmail.com</u>) as the central contact for information on grassroots efforts.
- Consult the Senate Bill 323 Resource Center for information and tools to assist outreach efforts.

Political Action Committee (PAC)

The current balance in the PAC account is \$46,379.29. Like grassroots outreach, PAC donations continue to be critical. CANP is currently developing enhanced tactics and materials to further assist PAC solicitation efforts.

Action for Chapters:

- Emphasize the importance of contributing to the CANP PAC.
- Utilize the "<u>Political Action Committee Guidelines</u>" document to host a CANP PAC fundraising event.



CANP renewal efforts are ongoing with members renewing on a monthly basis. As CANP notifies members several times regarding their upcoming renewal, it is equally important for chapter leaders to reach out to those members as well. Membership invoices are available in the member's "My Account" section on <u>canpweb.org</u>.

The Chapter Leadership Toolset is available on <u>canpweb.org</u> for chapter leaders to access reports on new and renewing members for contact and reporting purposes.

CANP has a standing goal of growing membership by 5% annually. In order to achieve this goal, chapters are asked to motivate members to renew on time, encourage prospective members and colleagues to join, and reach out to continue engagement between chapter leaders and members.

Action for Chapters:

- Urge chapter members who are suspended or expired to renew their membership. Let chapter members know that invoices are available up to 60 days prior to their expiration date.
- Contact members that haven't attended a meeting lately and re-invite them to attend meetings -- the personal contact provides a great opportunity to re-engage the member.
- Offer creative incentives for people to promote CANP membership to colleagues.

Membership Committee

The Membership Committee meets on the first Monday of each month via conference call. The call takes place from 8:00 - 8:30 p.m. Committee members are encouraged to reach out to prospective members and people that have not renewed their membership.

Action for Chapters:
