### **President's Call to Action!**

President Donna Emanuele sent communications to members compelling them to engage in direct grassroots outreach to state legislators in their area.

The communication is quoted as "The introduction of Senate Bill 323 presents a monumental opportunity for all of us. It is an opportunity that must be seized, and it's your chance to be the difference in the pursuit of full practice authority.

That's where we're counting on you. <u>It is absolutely critical that all CANP members become</u> engaged in direct grassroots outreach to state legislators in your area.

No one is better equipped to tell the story of the vital role that nurse practitioners play than NPs themselves – and nothing will help to make our case better than having a conversation with your elected officials. When you establish a relationship with them, you become a resource, an expert, someone they can look to for information to help them make the right decision on Senate Bill 323.

CANP has numerous tools and opportunities to make it easy for you to get involved:

- Got to our online <u>Senate Bill 323 Resource Center</u> for a host of information and tools to help you make the case for full practice authority.
- Work through your local CANP chapter to organize district office visits with legislators and their staff members.
- Join us May 19 in Sacramento for <u>CANP Lobby Day 2015</u> and be one of more than a hundred NPs visiting with legislators at the State Capitol in support of Senate Bill 323.
- Contact CANP Grassroots Coordinator Stephanie Tseu (<u>canpgrassroots@gmail.com</u>) for help in navigating and effectively engaging in the legislative process.

Senate Bill 323 will face powerful opposition. Only through the sheer force of our commitment, our passion, our unity and our engagement can we hope to prevail."

After first being introduced February 23 as a placeholder (or "spot") bill, Senate Bill 323 was amended on March 26 by co-authors Sen. Ed Hernandez and Assemblymember Susan Eggman to insert the substance of a proposal to grant full practice authority to California nurse practitioners. See the text of the bill as amended March 26. The bill is due for its first policy committee hearing on April 20, when it will be heard by the Senate Committee on Business and Professions.

Since the introduction of the bill, CANP has sounded the drumbeat over the critical need for all members to engage in grassroots outreach activities to their local members of the state legislature. The need for engagement on the part of all members was a recurring theme throughout the recent 38th Annual Educational Conference, and a personal letter from CANP President Donna Emanuele was sent to all members on April 14 to further stress the vital nature of the grassroots effort and to provide guidance on how to get involved. This included a call to attend CANP Lobby Day 2015, taking place May 19 in Sacramento.

On the day the bill was introduced, CANP launched its online <u>Senate Bill 323 Resource Center</u>, which includes a host of information and tools to help members make the case for SB 323.

The importance of chapters carrying out their explicit direction to appoint a Legislative Representative to coordinate local outreach cannot be overstated. While many chapters have been actively engaged in outreach to their local officials for many months, it is clear that some chapters have yet to take this vital first step. With significant opposition a certainty, the success of the bill will depend on CANP's members and allies becoming fully engaged in grassroots outreach efforts in order to bolster ongoing lobbying efforts already taking place at the State Capitol.

# **Action for Chapters:**

- For assistance in navigating making appointments with Legislators, consult with Grassroots Coordinator Stephanie Tseu (<u>canpgrassroots@gmail.com</u>) as the central contact for information on grassroots efforts.
- Consult the Senate Bill 323 Resource Center for information and tools to assist outreach efforts.
- Designate one Legislative Representative per Chapter as one key contact for the Chapter.

### **Political Action Committee (PAC)**

In anticipation of the full practice authority bill, further efforts have been devoted to increasing contributions to CANP's Political Action Committee (PAC). A strategy for spurring PAC donations was developed, entailing aggressive marketing tactics via email, direct mail, social media and the CANP website. A revised version of the CANP PAC web page was launched, including a more targeted call to action, information on how to make a contribution, and a "how to" manual to help chapters in hosting their own PAC fundraisers.

Spurred in part by continual promotion of the support effort during the conference, onsite contributions to the PAC totaled more than \$27,000, far exceeding both the week's goals and any previous level of onsite PAC contribution activity.

### **Action for Chapters:**

Emphasize the importance of contributing to the CANP PAC.

Utilize the "<u>Political Action Committee Guidelines</u>" document to host a CANP PAC fundraising event.



CANP renewal efforts are ongoing with members renewing on a monthly basis. As CANP notifies members several times regarding their upcoming renewal, it is equally important for chapter leaders to reach out to those members as well. ### **Action for Chapters:**

- Offer creative incentives for people to promote CANP membership to colleagues.
