Advocacy

Legislative Update

After adjourning for summer recess, lawmakers returned to Sacramento on August 21st for the final month of the 2017 session. Much has occurred over the past four weeks, including the election of a new Assembly Republican leader. With just days remaining until the end of the 2017 legislative session, the fates of hundreds of bills have yet to decided, including new proposals that surfaced as last minute deals were negotiated before the end of session. However, new transparency rules enacted by voters last year require all bills to be in print and accessible to the public for at least 72 hours before being acted upon, so legislators will have to be more deliberate about "gut and amend" bills during this final week of session.

On August 24th, Assembly Republicans elected Assemblyman Brian Dahle (R-Bieber) as Assembly Republican Leader, replacing Chad Mayes, who has led the minority caucus since early 2016. Mayes delivered seven Republican votes in favor of Governor Brown's cap-andtrade extension in July. He immediately experienced blowback for those votes from the more conservative members of the Assembly Republican Caucus, in addition to California GOP leaders across the state. Several Assembly Republicans initially threw their hat into the ring to replace Mayes as leader, but after an unsuccessful vote to oust him on August 21st, Brian Dahle ultimately got the votes on August 24th. Dahle takes over as leader on September 15th.

On the legislative front, CANP continues to engage and support a number of priority bills. On September 11th, Governor Brown signed SB 554, which codifies in state law the recent changes in federal law, the Comprehensive Addiction Recovery Act (CARA), that allow NPs and PAs to receive a waiver from the DEA and the authority to prescribe medication for opioid addiction treatment. SB 554 passed out of the Assembly on July 17th and is back in the Senate for concurrence before it goes to the Governor for signature. CANP actively supports this bill.

SB 799 by Senate Business, Professions and Economic Development Committee chairman Jerry Hill (D-San Mateo) passed out of the Legislature on September 13th and is en route to the Governor. The bill extends the sunset date of the Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) until 2022. Every four years, boards operating under the Department of Consumer Affairs must undergo a "sunset review" process, by which the boards are evaluated by the Legislature and authorized to continue operating for another four years. Because the BRN protects patients while

safeguarding the integrity of the nursing profession, including scope of practice and continuing education, CANP is supporting SB 799.

AB 1368, the California Academy of Physician Assistants' (CAPA) bill that would allow PAs and NPs to sign any authorization form required by the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) for Medi-Cal benefits and services, is now a two-year bill. CANP successfully worked with CAPA to amend AB 1368 to include NPs in the same authority. Unfortunately, the Medi-Cal program within the California Department of Healthcare Services (DHCS) raised implementation concerns about the bill and has adopted an oppose position. Without the agreement of the Department, the bill would have certainly faced a veto upon reaching the Governor's desk, so efforts must be made to resolve their concerns. The bill was placed on the Inactive File on September 5th, so work to resolve the department's concerns will likely resume next year.

AB 1560, CANP's sponsored bill to increase the physician to nurse practitioner supervision ratio to one physician to supervising twelve NPs, is also now a two-year bill. As we previously reported, the opposition was unwilling to come to a compromise that would preserve the usefulness of the bill, despite multiple amendments. Opponents wanted to further limit the physician to NP supervision ratio. AB 1560 is a two-year bill and CANP will continue to work with opponents to resolve their concerns. While it won't pass this year, it continues to help CANP educate legislators and staff about how NPs practice, how the supervision model actually works (i.e. no direct supervision), and is a way for us to advance our NP practice discussion.

Last but not least, AB 422 by Assemblyman Arambula cleared the Legislature and is on its way to the Governor. Without AB 422, the CSU's authority to enroll new students in the DNP program will expire on July 1, 2018. This authority is necessary for the CSU to grow its own nursing faculty and maintain critical industry partnerships while meeting California's healthcare workforce needs.

As we previously reported, the bill by Senator Ricardo Lara (D-Bell Gardens) to implement a single-payer healthcare system in California (SB 562) is dead for the year, having been tabled in June by Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon. Since then, Speaker Rendon announced the formation of the Assembly Select Committee on Health Care Delivery Systems and Universal Coverage, chaired by Dr. Joaquin Arambula (D-Fresno) and Dr. Jim Wood (D-Healdsburg). The Committee will hold hearings this fall to examine single-payer and discuss expansion of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and "hybrid systems."

As the 2017 Legislative Session comes to a close, the Governor's and Legislature's largest priority is affordable housing. Some of the housing bills moving through the Legislature require 2/3rds votes, so Democrats will likely need to flex their supermajority power to pass parts of the housing package. Legislators are also focusing on energy legislation, cap-and-trade funding, and immigration. All bills must be passed by September 15th, and any bill not sent to the Governor by that date is dead for the year. The Governor has until October 15th to act on all legislation.
