Association Updates

AB 890 Heads to Assembly Appropriations

The Assembly Appropriations Committee has placed #AB890 on its Suspense File, a common move for bills identified as having significant fiscal impact. As it stands, the committee will not take testimony, and it will determine Thursday, May 16 whether to approve or hold the bill. Read the committee's analysis of AB 890.

Get Answers About AB 890

The California Association for Nurse Practitioners (CANP) has hosted several calls with members to answer questions about AB 890. On April 25, we held a meeting exclusive to chapter leaders, and on May 2 for all members of the organization. The Association is now offering the opportunity for members to have brief **one-on-one discussions** with two of our foremost policy experts.

This offering represents a revision to our initial plan announced last week to host a pair of conference calls for members to ask questions. We've heard from members that they wish to instead ask their *specific* AB 890 questions in a one-on-one session rather than through a group discussion. Therefore, we are offering four windows during which members can have just such an opportunity.

This means the two previously announced *conference calls* (May 14 from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m., and May 20 from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m.) have been cancelled.

The four "office hours" sessions will feature Susie Phillips, DNP, NP, FAANP, Associate Dean at the UC Irvine Sue & Bill Gross School of Nursing; and Garrett Chan, PhD, NP, CNS, FAAN,

President & CEO of HealthImpact and Associate Clinical Professor at UC San Francisco. Both Susie and Garrett have extensive experience in nurse practitioner practice and legislative matters, and are advising CANP on AB 890.

The four opportunities are:

- Tuesday, May 14, 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. with Susie Phillips
- Thursday, May 16, 10:00 to 11:00 a.m. with Garret Chan
- Monday, May 20, 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. with Susie Phillips
- Thursday, May 23, 10:00 to 11:00 a.m. with Garrett Chan

Garrett and Susie will schedule individual sessions of approximately 10 minutes each during these windows. In order to arrange a time for one-on-one discussion, consult the schedule above, then email either Garrett at garrett@healthimpact.org or Susie at siphilli@uci.edu to reserve a timeslot.

Lobby Day 19

CANP Lobby Day 19 took place Monday, May 13. We had 173 nurse practitioners in attendance and presentations from Assemblymember Jim Wood, the author of AB 890; CANP's legislative advocate Kristy Wiese; Jaye Priest, CANP's social media director and Lindsey Goodwin of Randle Communications spoke about the latest with social media in advocacy.

Taxes

It is each chapter's responsibility to apply and maintain federal and state tax-exempt status. CANP offers the following resources to assist chapters with filing their taxes:

- <u>CANP Chapter Federal & State Filing Exemption Instruction Manual</u> Provides direction in how to verify your chapter's status and other helpful resources
- Ask a Tax Question Allows chapter leaders to ask questions about tax filings and other issues related to financial aspects of running a local chapter
- Twice yearly leadership calls focused on tax filings (January and August)

As a reminder: If your chapter tax year is *calendar year* (ending December 31), please file your federal and California tax returns by March 15. If you are on a *fiscal year* (ending June 30), please file your federal and California tax returns by September 15th. Please consult your chapter tax advisor for more detailed information.
