AB 890

On September 29, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom signed AB 890 by Assemblymember Jim Wood (D-Santa Rosa) into law after it passed through both houses of the California Legislature with broad bipartisan support.

AB 890 allows NPs to work without physician supervision, removing the supervisory requirement in existing law so NPs can provide the same highquality care they do today and care more directly for patients.



We want to recognize and thank our chapter leaders who have worked tirelessly to elevate the severity of California's growing provider shortage and demonstrate how NPs can help all Californians, especially underserved and rural communities, gain desperately needed access to health care. Our work is not finished. There are many intricacies of this law, and CANP is here to help members understand its implementation.

We were honored to have Assembly member Jim Wood join us for our AB 890 Town Hall last week. Newly Formed Health Justice Workgroup

CANP's has a newly formed Health Justice Workgroup that seeks to address health inequity related to social injustice. As health care providers working in health care systems and educational institutions, we have a unique opportunity to shape inequitable systems that serve vulnerable populations in our community. The Health Justice Workgroup was created last month to further identify how CANP might best support nurse practitioners in health justice work (such as integrating these health justice principles into education, clinical practice, leadership, and advocacy for systemic change). As engaged leaders across the state, we are seeking your input into how we might approach and prioritize this work.

For our November 18 meeting, we ask each chapter begin to consider the following questions:

- 1. If you and your chapter have already begun addressing health justice (which may be labeled elsewhere as social justice, racial justice, health equity, diversity and inclusion, or health advocacy), please share with us what you have done and what you have learned from this work.
- 2. Do you have ideas or visions about how CANP could engage in this work—both within our organization and in collaboration with other organizations?
- 3. What support or resources do you feel you need as a Chapter Leader to do this work?
- 4. What other questions do you have on this topic?

Taxes

It is each chapter's responsibility to apply for and maintain federal and state tax-exempt status. CANP offers the following resources to assist chapters with filing their taxes:

- <u>CANP Chapter Federal & State Filing Exemption Instruction Manual</u> Provides direction in how to verify your chapter's status and other helpful resources
- <u>Ask a Tax Question</u> Allows chapter leaders to ask questions about tax filings and other issues related to financial aspects of running a local chapter
- Twice yearly leadership calls focused on tax filings (January and August)

As a reminder: If your chapter tax year is calendar year (ending December 31) and your chapter is a corporation, please file your federal and California tax returns by March 15. If your chapter is tax exempt, the tax filing date is May 15. If your chapter is on a fiscal year (ending June 30), please file your federal and California tax returns by September 15. If you are tax exempt, the deadline November 15. Please consult your chapter tax advisor for more detailed information.

Political Action Committee

The Political Action Committee (PAC) is a critical part of the Association's advocacy efforts, and we encourage chapters to continue to raise funds. The PAC funds convey our strength in numbers and a commitment to engage in the legislative process. The current balance in the PAC account is \$42,694.

Note: All PAC donations must be submitted via personal check or credit card. Donations via cash or cashier's check are <u>not</u> permitted. All donations must be submitted to CANP no later than 30 days post receipt of the donation.
