AB 890 Implementation

The California Association for Nurse Practitioners (CANP) has been working on implementation of AB 890 through regulatory and legislative efforts. We will be selectively calling upon CANP chapters and members to engage in support of these initiatives.

[AB 852](#), the legislation by Assemblymember Jim Wood (D-Santa Rosa) to clarify language in AB 890, continues to make its way through the legislature.

The bill passed unanimously on a bipartisan vote out of Assembly

Appropriations Committee on May 5, after having passed in Assembly Business & Professions on April 20.

In Assembly Business & Professions, there were a number of amendments made to AB 852, including technical changes to the Clinic Laboratory Technology Act and the Pharmacy Act and deletion of language amending the Physical Therapy Act. AB 852 was also amended to include clarification about what professional titles NPs should use to represent themselves. Language was also included to clarify joint liability when a nurse practitioner consults with a physician. Our CANP-led [Close the Provider Gap coalition letter](#) has been updated accordingly.

In 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom signed [AB 890](#) by Assemblymember Jim Wood (D-Santa Rosa) into law after it passed through both houses of the California Legislature with broad bipartisan support. AB 890 allows NPs to work without physician supervision, removing the supervisory requirement in existing law so NPs can provide the same high-quality care they do today and care more directly for patients.

Chapter Quarterly Reports

March 31 marked the end of the third quarter for CANP's 2020-2021 fiscal year. The Quarter 3 reports were distributed in mid-January via email to all Chapter Presidents.

Reminder, all chapters must submit a quarterly report and meet the elements outlined in Addendum D of the [CANP and CANP Chapter Alignment Agreement](#) to receive a dues check. Per Addendum D of the Alignment Agreement, if the compliance measures are not met in any quarter, that quarter's chapter dues disbursement check will not be issued to the chapter. Also, per terms of the Alignment Agreement, checks will not be distributed retroactively.
