HPPC Committee Member Nomination

The California Association for Nurse Practitioners (CANP) is currently seeking members for the <u>Health Policy and Practice Committee</u> (HPPC). This committee is composed of CANP members who are designated to focus on certain aspects of health policy and practice issues. The official call for committee members will be sent to members the first week of October. Advocacy - SB 1375

CANP-sponsored <u>SB 1375</u> (Atkins) was passed by the California Legislature and awaits Governor Gavin Newsom's consideration. This important bill will allow qualified nurse practitioners (NPs) to provide critical abortion and reproductive services without the supervision of a physician. The Governor has until September 30 to act on the bill.
