Medi-Cal Provider Manual Updated to Reflect AB 890

After the enactment of AB 890 (Wood, 2020), CANP focused its attention to ensure that the Medi-Cal Provider Manual was updated to reflect the changes to how nurse practitioners are supervised and can bill for services provided to Medi-Cal enrollees. CANP remains committed to expanding access to care for all Californians and given that many NPs treat Medi-Cal enrollees, it was critical that the Medi-Cal program reflect these changes. CANP advocated for the Department of Health Care Services to make these changes and worked with the Department for over a year, along with our subject matter experts, to ensure these changes were made. We provided feedback on the proposed changes to the manual along with technical advice about how to best reflect the work that NPs are doing in the Medi-Cal program.

While it was a long process, it was an important one. CANP is very grateful for the support and collaboration we received from the staff at the Department of Health Care Services as we worked through this process.

Contributions from any individual or entity may not exceed \$9,100 in any single year.

The <u>45th Annual Educational Conference</u>, supported by NSO, took place on March 16-19, 2023 at the Monterey Marriott and Monterey Conference Center.

Our esteemed opening keynote speaker was one of the many highlights. Kimberly D. Acquaviva, PhD, MSW, CSE, FNAP is the Betty Norman Norris Endowed Professor at the University of Virginia School of Nursing, delivered an enlightening presentation on providing inclusive LGBTQIA+ care.

Following the Annual Legislative Update from CANP Legislative Advocate Kristy Wiese, we hosted a discussion on AB 890 Implementation with an esteemed panel of experts, including CANP President Cynthia Jovanov (moderator), Loretta Melby, BRN Executive Officer; Samantha Gambles Farr, NPAC
