a. BRN's 103 NP Application

 - The BRN recognizes there are glitches in the application process and is working to resolve them.
- iv. To become certified as a 103, an NP must have completed a minimum of 3 full-time equivalent years or 4,600 hours in direct patient care prior to completing the attestation.
- v. To become certified as a 104, an NP must be practicing as a 103 NP in good standing for at least 3 full-time equivalents or 4600 hours in direct patient care. You cannot use the same hours you reported to become 103 certified. When you become a 103, your hours start at 0 again.
- vi. Don't look at the setting, look at the population.
