PREFERENCE will be given to qualified active chapter members who are enrolled in an accredited graduate nursing programs for Master of Science in Nursing (MSN), Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP), Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing (PhD), Certified Nurse Midwives, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNA) or Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNS) as a part-time and/or full-time student.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Part One

1. Submit a completed application by May 15, 2018 @ 7:30PM PST
2. Submit proof of FT/PT enrollment at an accredited graduate nursing program
3. Must have been a member of CANP-Channel Islands Chapter for at least three months.
4. Must have attended at least 1 (one) chapter meeting prior to the application submission due date, May 15, 2018
5. Provide proof of your NP political grassroots activities, such as but not limited to:
 - Use of Social Media sharing our chapter grassroots activities or CANP Legislative activities
 - Face-to-Face meeting with an Elected Official on behalf or NPs and/or sent letters seeking support
 - Attended a CANP Lobby Day, or participated with another organization in support of NPs
